However, since the LPS Regulations have come into effect, it is now required that local governments establish independent heritage lists and on the basis of the specific considerations now set out in the Deemed Provisions.
- 9. A place being entered in a heritage list allows for the protection and conservation of those aspects of a place that are of cultural heritage significance, and also allows the cultural heritage significance of the place to be considered as part of any development proposal relating to the place. As with any decision of a local government under its local planning scheme, there is a right to request review by the State Administrative Tribunal in relation to any decision or action taken dealing with heritage matters.
