



# A message from the Shire President

Continued from cover.

Major capital works – the budget provides for \$1m in capital works. The major projects include:

- Resealing Leake Street from The Grove to View Street roundabout.
- Resealing part of Johnston Street (precise area and timing to be scheduled in tandem with Watercorp pipe replacement project for the street to minimise disruption).
- Construction of the river wall headland at the bottom of Leake Street to prevent erosion. Scheduled for October/November.
- Upgrade of remote geothermal monitoring to The Grove.
- Widening of the footpath beside the library from Leake Street to Hurstford Close.

**Planning - Activity Centre** - The budget provides \$40,000 for the first phase of development planning for the Cottesloe Central site which was rezoned to an Activity Centre in the Local Planning Scheme introduced in 2017. This will be subject to a further report to Council. It is intended that the plan would be done in partnership with the Town of Cottesloe who are progressing strategic planning for their town centre area.

**Assistance for heritage-listed property owners** – The Council recognises that heritage properties make a significant contribution to the character, amenity and value of the Shire. We have budgeted to introduce a Heritage Support Scheme to assist the owners of heritage-listed properties through the provision of external heritage advice and modest matching grants. The key focus would be on the street amenity of the property and structural integrity. It is not intended that the support would be for internal works unless these are of a structural nature required to preserve the property. The Council is currently working through the details to draw up a policy which will

be advertised for community consultation and feedback.

**Manners Hill Pavilion Restoration** – Funds have been provided in the budget to repaint the pavilion in its original heritage colours and, subject to costs, to install feature lighting.

**Community** - An amount of \$5,000 has been set aside to commence a review of the Shire's Community Strategic Plan. The budget continues to provide funding for our major events of Halloween, Carols by Candlelight and Australia Day. The budget also provides \$20,000 for the replacement and enhancement of Christmas decorations in the Shire. Council continues to provide financial support to SHINE Community Services for the provision of services to older residents in the Shire.



**Loans and reserve funds** - The Shire has not taken out any new loans and the reserve fund balances are projected to be \$1.18 million as at 30 June 2020. The largest reserve fund is the Building/Infrastructure reserve with a projected balance of \$645,000 at 30 June 2020.

## Shire Traffic Review

The Shire recently commissioned a review of the traffic flow on View, Leake and Johnston Streets, collecting data such as the number of vehicles, the speed they travel and the time of the day at set locations.

This information was compared against previous counts in Peppermint Grove and compared with statistics for the overall Perth metropolitan area.

**Some of the key findings from the 2019 traffic review were:**

- Overall the incidence and severity of recorded crashes is low, and the number of crashes per annum has decreased.
- Whilst the historic traffic speed data suggests that speed limits are typically gradually decreasing, the occasional maximum recorded speeds have typically increased. This opposing trend suggests the issue is behavioural with some drivers deliberately choosing to drive at high speed in contravention of WA speed and hoon behaviour laws and this issue should be best treated by law enforcement by the WA Police.
- The Shire has a mobile variable message speed display device that will be located periodically along View Street, between Irvine Street and Keane Street to alert drivers to their speed at times along the street. This will assist to highlight the need to reduce speeds along this road section to the local community.



## A message from the Shire President

2019/2020 Budget



The Financial Health Indicator (FHI) is a measurement of a local government's overall financial health. An FHI result of 70+ indicates sound financial health. The maximum result achievable is 100.

Council adopted the Shire's 2019/2020 budget at a Special Council Meeting held on 2 July 2019. Total projected revenue for 2019/2020 is \$5.37 million of which rates make up \$3.31 million. Operating expenditure will be \$5.06 million.

The budget provides for a rate increase of one percent which the Council considers is in keeping with community expectations for the Shire to be prudent and restrained on rate increases whilst at the same time ensuring that services are maintained and, where possible, enhanced. Key outcomes from the budget for

2019/2020 include the following:

### Environmental Sustainability Improvements

**Solar** - the budget provides for the installation of a total of 100kw of solar panels to service the library and administration centre. These panels will replace the original 20kw installed when the building was built ten years ago. This will generate up to \$40,000 in electricity savings and reduce CO2 emissions by 100,000kg per annum.

## Freshwater Bay Erosion Control Project

Freshwater Bay has long been a popular recreation area used by families, walkers, swimmers, dog owners, divers, stand-up paddle boarders, recreational boaters and people just wanting a pleasant shady place to sit or read a book.

In recent years a section of the Freshwater Bay foreshore near Leake Street has become badly eroded and remedial work is required to preserve the foreshore and minimise further damage.

The Shire is pleased to announce that after community consultation, it recently secured State Government funding through a Riverbank grant from Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions to undertake important works in this section of Freshwater Bay aimed at addressing erosion and other related issues. Construction is scheduled to start in spring in order to take advantage of the favourable weather and tidal conditions.
