## Message from the Shire President

#### 2021/2022 Budget

Council adopted the Shire's 2021/22 budget at the Ordinary Council Meeting held on 22 June 2021. Total projected revenue for 2021/22 is \$4.9 million of which rates income contributes \$3.345 million.

#### **Strategic Community Plan**

Council has just completed a review of our Strategic Community Plan (SCP). The Plan covers a tenyear period to 2031. The Plan is a legislated strategic requirement for all local governments in WA. It has been developed with input from residents and sets the community's goals and aspirations which will guide Council's strategic direction. Major findings from the plan were community commitment to the preservation of heritage, maintaining and improving the Shire's urban tree canopy and enhancing the Peppermint Grove/ Cottesloe Village precinct, this will be done in partnership with the Town of Cottesloe.

SCP shapes the Shire's budget to achieve these outcomes by allocating funds for a heritage grants program; the development of an urban tree canopy strategy; review of the Shire's Local Planning Strategy and for the Peppermint Grove/Cottesloe Village project. #### Rates

Council is mindful of the financial pressures some ratepayers are currently facing and has endeavoured to keep the rate increase to a minimum, with this in mind rates will be \$3.345 million, based on a 1.7% rate increase - a 1% increase in rates revenue equates to \$33,000. The minimum rate will also increase by 1.7% to \$1,424.

During 2019/20 Council adopted a COVID-19 hardship policy. We undertsand that COVID-19 impacts continue for many of us and ratepayers are encouraged to contact the Shire if they are experiencing hardship due to COVID-19.

#### **Waste Charges**

The Shire's rate charge includes waste collection services for general waste, recycling and green organic waste. Your annual rates charge include the verge valet bulk waste collection service. It provides for three general waste and three green waste collections during the year. Residents who require additional services can organise this on a fee basis.

## Message from the Shire President (cont.)

#### The Grove Library and Community Centre Contributions

The net operating cost of running the Grove Library and Community Centre is met by the three member councils - the Towns of Mosman Park and Cottesloe and the Shire. The level of contribution is based on census population data for each Council. The net operating cost for 2021/22 for the library, history unit and community centre is \$1,161,645.

#### **Economic Stimulus Grants**

The Federal Government has provided local governments with Local Road and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCI) grants. The grants are to stimulate local economies and reduce the economic impact of COVID-19.

The Shire's Phase 1 grant of \$49,642 was used to offset costs for the Stirling Highway footpath upgrade between Cottesloe Central and Irvine Street. The 2021/22 budget includes Phase 2 (\$78,350) and Phase 3 (\$99,284) grants.

The Phase 2 grant and part of Phase 3 have been allocated in the CAPEX program towards the cost of improving parking around Manners Hill Park. This will be subject to community consultation before the project proceeds. The balance of the Phase 3 grant of \$62,380 will continue the upgrade of the footpath along Stirling Highway south of Irvine Street.

#### Asset Management Plan and Capital Works Program

As part of our commitment to careful financial management the Council has adopted a comprehensive Asset Management Plan (AMP). The AMP identifies the funds required by the Shire on an annual basis, projected for 10 years, this ensures that the Shire's assets are maintained to a high standard. The Capital Works program in the 2021/22 budget reflects the funds required to be allocated to meet the AMP requirements.

Asset renewal or upgrade projects total \$477,400 of which \$47,182 is met by the Towns of Cottesloe and Mosman Park as contributions towards library capital expenditure; \$50,000 will come from fleet trade-in values; \$135,000 is transferred from reserves and the balance of \$245,218 will be met from the Shire's municipal fund.

New capital works total \$413,350 with grant funding of \$177,634 from the Federal Government's LCRI Phase 2 and 3 Grants.

Three new flagpoles were erected at the front of the Shire's Administration building as well as directional LED flood lighting.

In addition to the Australian National flag, we can now fly the Aboriginal flag and Shire Pennant flag.

Michael previously worked at the City of Vincent and is keen to assist the Shire in its Planning, Building and related compliance activities.

## St John First Aid FREE Workshops for Seniors

In partnership with the Towns of Cottesloe and Mosman Park we organised two days in May of First Aid training courses for Seniors which were well attended.

Participants learnt about basic first aid and principles including common injuries and illnesses that occur in everyday life. St John covered both theory and practical demonstrations including CPR, the recovery position and how to use a defibrillator.



## Edith Cowan Exhibition Following in her footsteps



In commemoration of 100 years since Edith Cowan's maiden speech in Parliament, the Grove Library hosted an exhibition in July recounting the life of this inspiring woman.

She pioneered social causes and was instrumental in the establishment of the National Council for Women, The Children's Protection Society, Women's Service Guild, The WA Nurses Association and the RSPCA-WA (to name but a few).

The exhibition guided us through Edith's hardships, joys and achievements. Her mother died during childbirth in 1868 when Edith was only seven, and her father was convicted of murder after he shot his new wife. Edith then not only had a mother who died when she

was seven, but a father who was hung when she was 15. Although Edith suffered a traumatic childhood, she learnt to overcome adversity from a young age and grew to become one of the most influential women in WA history.

The exhibition was curated by the Founder of the Edith Dircksey Cowan Commemoration and Hilary Silbert in collaboration with The Community History Library.

## Johnston St and Venn St road re-sealing project

The Water Corporation completed their pipe replacement program, and the Shire of Peppermint Grove was able to carry out road upgrades on Johnston St and Venn St, plus the Shire controlled sections of Harvey St, Solomon St, Palmerston St and Bay View Terrace.

Works included installation of new drainage pits, footpath repairs, kerbing replacement, profiling (grinding off the old pavement), road resurfacing with new asphalt and line marking the new road. Additionally, the concrete median island at Cottesloe Primary School was removed and replaced by a guard-controlled pedestrian crossing, in order to improve student road safety.

### Reticulation Renewal Project



As part of the Shire of Peppermint Grove's FY20/21 Capital Works Program, all the underground reticulation infrastructure at Manners Hill Park, Keanes Point Reserve and the Foreshore have been renewed.

This massive project involved replacement of all old pipework, wiring, valves and sprinklers as well as installation of an inline fertiliser application system. Our new system should significantly improve the efficiency of the reticulation network, provide far better irrigation coverage throughout the parks and reduce over watering and ongoing maintenance for Shire staff.


#### **Children's Programs**

## Did you know...

- The City of Nedlands undertake the Shire's pool inspections to ensure pool safety standards are maintained. If you have any queries with regard to the follow up of your pool inspection please call 9273 3500 and ask for Mary.
- Contamination in the green organic waste bins can cause issues with the mulching of the green waste. Please ensure you only put green waste into these bins and pass the message onto your gardener if you have one.
- We have received very positive feedback with 83% in favour of the **new Verge Valet Collection System** which was recently introduced to the Shire.
- You can change, cancel, or postpone your verge valet booking up to one business day before your collection date. Click the CHANGE A BOOKING tab on www.vergevalet.com.au or phone the Verge Valet Collection Team on 6336 7223. Please ensure you give at least one business day as notice or you will lose your collection allocation.
- If you have **excess green waste** to get rid of you can use your bulk waste passes as green waste passes (but not the other way around).
- In the Grove Foyer we have a small recycling station where you can drop off your household batteries, light globes, Fluro tubes and printer cartridges.





- You can dispose of a multitude of household hazardous waste FREE at West Metropolitan Recycling Centre (WMRC) such as: cooking oil, motor oil, plastic plant pots, X-rays, aerosols and spray cans, smoke detectors, bulk polystyrene, paint, fire extinguishers (red only). Proof of residence is required.
- There's also paid services to **drop off** construction & demolition waste, mattresses, tyres, refrigerated appliances and asbestos.
- WMRC offers **free mulch** to Peppermint Grove residents, however proof of residence is required.

## Keanes Point and Manners Hill accessible paths

New paths were constructed at Manners Hill Park and Keanes Point linking the public toilets and other infrastructure to existing footpaths, parking and recreational areas. These paths provide convenient access for all.

## Stirling Highway footpath upgrade

The old red brick footpath on Stirling Hwy between Irvine St and Cottesloe Central Shopping Centre was replaced with new exposed aggregate pavers.

This project was co-funded via the Federal Government's LCRI grant scheme and has lifted the amenity of the area for pedestrians and shoppers.
